## Chamber Backed Jobs Impact Statement Mandated by New Rules in Both Senate & House of Delegates

Effective immediately, both Houses have mandated that any new bill introduced that has a "potential impact on the state's economy" should be evaluated on its potential impact on "jobs," or the state's economy in general. The House ([House Resolution 1](#)) calls it an "Economic Impact Statement" and the Senate ([Senate Resolution 1](#)) a "Jobs Impact Statement." The two legislative presiding officers may request such statements from any of the state's colleges or universities.



What's the significance of this simple change to the rules of each House? First of all, it's a very inexpensive way to make sure legislators and the Administration understand just how specific proposals cause a positive or negative impact on job creation and economic growth in the state. Second, and most meaningful, requiring such an economic analysis of proposed legislation will allow the Legislature to improve the climate for jobs in the state and gain a better understanding of how subsequent proposals will have an impact on the state's business climate."

For the past few years, the WV Chamber, on behalf of the state's business community, has strongly advocated this action. This will assist the Legislature in knowing ahead of time whether their actions will create jobs for the state or stymie state growth by causing a loss in jobs. The West Virginia Chamber applauds the Legislature for this very simple, but extremely meaningful action.

## Bills to Address Significant Barriers to Economic Development Introduced

Bills have been introduced to address three significant areas the Chamber believes will strengthen the state's



economy and assist in creating new jobs. They include:

- Measures to significantly improve the condition of the state's educational system, thus giving our children a greater opportunity for future success. Bills have been advanced to permit Charter Schools, allow alternative programs for the education of teachers that will assist in areas of the state that have teacher shortages and critical needs, and the creation of a teacher corps program.
- Bills to reform serious inequities in the state's civil justice system including punitive damages, joint & several liability, medical monitoring and a number of others.
- A bill requiring the nonpartisan elections of all justices to the West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals, circuit court judges, family court judges and magistrates.
