Chamber President Believes Legislature is Committed to Improving WV

Commenting on the legislative session so far, Chamber President Steve Roberts says, "It seems clear this Legislature is committed to solving issues that affect the state's economy. From all indications, their mission is to create jobs, improve education for our children and make West Virginia irresistible to businesses seeking a place to locate or expand jobs."



Fourteen days into the 2015 regular legislative session, legislators have introduced 782 bills --- 443 in the House and 339 in the Senate. The first bill passed by both Houses is expected to be on its way to the Governor later this week. The bill, [HB 2001](#), repeals a law enacted in 2009 that requires electric utilities to use an increasing amount of energy resources, other than coal, over the next few decades. Proponents of the bill strongly believe the current law is costing coal mining jobs and increasing both residential and commercial electric bills.

Most bills are still being analyzed by committees in both Houses. Forty-six days still remain for action on the State Budget and a laundry list of other measures expected to be acted upon this session.

Senate Passes Bill to Change Law on Payment Time to Separated Employees

The Senate last Friday passed a measure to change current law governing payment of final wages to separated employees ([SB 12](#)). Currently, such employees must be paid their final wages at the next regular payday or within four business days, whichever comes first. The Senate bill seeks to require payment by the next regular payday. According to Chamber President Steve Roberts, "The bill is needed to standardize the



time period for payment, which will assist primarily small businesses without active human resources departments to make the payments on time and not incur the severe penalties that are currently in the law." The bill is currently being reviewed by the House Industry & Labor Committee.

House Education Committee Approves Alternative Teacher Certification Bill



After a lengthy meeting last night, the House Education Committee approved a bill allowing alternative teacher certification programs ([HB 2005](#)). If adopted by the House and Senate, the bill would assist in provided teachers in areas of the state that have critical needs and shortages. According to the state Department of Education, a 2014 report found 700 vacant teacher positions in the state. The bill now goes to the House Finance Committee for a fiscal review.
