Education Reform Takes Center Stage at the Capitol

The WV Chamber has led the effort to change the state's education policy to one that transforms public education so West Virginia can achieve the results necessary to compete in the world marketplace. This week, significant education reform bills began navigating the legislative process.



- **Charter Schools** --- The House Education Committee held two meetings this week and a Public Hearing on legislation to allow for charter schools in the state. Currently, forty states and the District of Columbia allow for public charter schools. House Education Chair Amanda Pasdon (R-Monongalia) noted, charter schools create a "unique learning environment that focuses on an individual student's needs and creates collaboration between parents, teachers and students." WV Chamber Special Issues Coordinator Eugenie Taylor told the committee, "The status quo is hard to defend. Those kids need you to be bold to give them options for a different model." The Chamber is a strong advocate of charter schools to offer West Virginia students the best opportunity to succeed and secure good-paying jobs and attain a good quality of life. [HB 2014](#) and [SB 14](#) both would allow charter schools in the state.
- **Alternative Teacher Certification** --- The House Education Committee has approved a bill allowing alternative teacher certification programs ([HB 2005](#)). If adopted by the House and Senate, the bill would assist in provided teachers in areas of the state that have critical needs and shortages. According to the state Department of Education, a 2014 report found 700 vacant teacher positions in the state. The bill now goes to the House Finance Committee for a fiscal review.

Legal Reform Bills Begin to Move

Joint & Several Liability --- [HB 2002](#), was passed by the House earlier this week and is now before the Senate Judiciary Committee. The bill ensures defendants would only be held responsible for the share of damages a jury decides was their fault.



Open & Obvious Risk --- [SB 13](#) passed 33-0 in the Senate on Tuesday. It raises the legal standard for suing a property owner when someone is injured by an open and obvious risk. The bill is slated to be on First Reading in the House on Monday.
