Legislative Update --- What Happened this Week of Interest to Chamber Members?

As the 2015 legislative session approaches its midpoint, this week saw movement on bills of interest to Chamber members.



SB 3 --- "Premises Liability" will codify existing common law relating to property owners not being held liable for the injuries or death of a person trespassing on their property. Passed by the Senate on 1/21 and the House on 1/29 and sent to the Governor for approval.

SB 12 --- "Wage Collection & Payment Act" changes the current law for payment of wages to a discharged employee to "on or before the next regular payday." Passed Senate 1/23; To House Industry & Labor Committee

SB 13 --- "Open & Obvious" raises the legal standard for suing a property owner when someone is injured by an open and obvious risk that is reasonably apparent, or was well known to the person injured. The bill was passed by the Senate on 1/27 & the House on 2/5, but there are differences in the two bills that must be worked out before it can be sent to the Governor.

SB 37 --- "Creating Revised Uniform Arbitration Act" will provide the state better and more complete arbitration procedures to meet modern needs, On Senate second reading 2/9

SB 361 --- "Prevailing Wage Rate" seeks to eliminate the requirement to pay prevailing wages for construction of public improvements. The bill is on second reading (amendment stage) in the Senate 2/9.

HB 2001 --- "Cap & Trade" bill repeals portions of the Alternative & Renewable Energy Portfolio Act. Passed House 1/22 and approved by the Senate 1/27. The Governor signed the bill 2/3.

HB 2002 --- "Joint & Several Liability (Comparative Fault)" ensures defendants will only be held responsible for the share of

damages a jury decides was their fault. Passed House 1/27 and will be on passage stage in the Senate 2/9 with the right to amend.

HB 2005 --- "Alternative programs for the education of teachers"

would assist in providing teachers in areas of the state that have critical needs and shortages. House second reading (amendment stage) 2/9.

HB 2010 --- "Non-partisan election of Judges" specifies that Supreme Court Justices, Circuit Judges, Family Court Judges and Magistrates will be elected on a non-partisan basis. Passed House 2/4: To Senate Judiciary Committee.
